BSR Members are invited to participate in a variety of collaborative initiatives ranging from learning communities to impact partnerships aimed at strengthening company performance, improving markets and industries, and contributing to systemic change for a more just and sustainable world. This document lists the BSR collaborative initiatives and partnerships that are available for companies to participate in during 2026.

BSR's Collaborations are organized by issue areas: Business Transformation, Climate and Nature, Human Rights and Inclusive Business, and Responsible Technology. This document includes a brief description of each initiative, pricing information, and a list of which departments beyond the sustainability team would benefit from participation. It also highlights for BSR members with annual dues of US\$15,000 or more how they can apply their BSR Member Engagement Option (MEO) to offset the annual fee for some initiatives.

The majority of BSR Collaborations run on a January-December schedule, with shorter-term opportunities running for designated periods and intervals. Most groups are open to members joining throughout the calendar year.

Companies are welcome and encouraged to participate in more than one collaborative initiative!
