


Lauren Aste Executive VP & General Counsel, CWT

Executive Director, World Childhood Foundation USA



Nicole is the former Associate Director of Court Appointed Special Advocates of Morris and Sussex Counties, where she implemented and managed community outreach and the Fostering Futures program that provided life skills, HIV and STDI screenings for teens in foster care that will age out of the child welfare system. Prior to CASA, Epps led the U.S. office of anti-trafficking organization Apne Aap and worked at New York-based victim services organization Safe Horizon.
