

What Does Preparation for EU CSDDD Look Like in Practice?

STEPS

1 Map your value chain and affected stakeholders to understand your company's impact footprint; identify and strategize on how to engage affected stakeholders.

2 Engage your Board of Directors on CSDDD and sustainability due diligence more broadly. Brief them on relevant human rights and environmental issues, including how impacts on people and the environment can create business risks and opportunities.

3 Build internal capacity on sustainability due diligence across functions and foster collaboration on the interconnected aspects of human rights and environmental impacts.

4 Conduct preliminary assessment of actual and potential impacts and review existing policies, due diligence processes, and grievance mechanisms to assess alignment with global sustainability due diligence frameworks and gaps against CSDDD expectations. Evaluate industry or multi-stakeholder initiatives that can support your company's due diligence efforts.

5 Develop and implement a roadmap for complying with the CSDDD, including key milestones for deepening assessment of your company's most severe and likely impacts, engaging with stakeholders, and addressing due diligence gaps.
